Use of the Premises by Outside Bodies

Rules concerning use of Alcohol on church premises

Alcohol must not be brought onto any part of the church premises unless specific written permission is given by the Church Administrator at the time when a booking is confirmed.

The rules covering its use and consumption are:

- 1) A valid Temporary Event Notice specifying that alcohol will be sold <u>or supplied</u> during the hiring must be given to the Chiltern District Council and the Thames Valley Police in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 and no objection notice must have been given by the latter body. A copy of the <u>approved</u> Temporary Event Notice shall be given to the Room Bookings Manager and a further copy shall be prominently displayed at the premises during the period of hire.
- 2) Alcohol must not be supplied by, to or for consumption by any person under the age of 18 years
- 3) Permission must be requested at the time of booking
- 4) Only wine, beer and cider may be served: no spirits are allowed
- 5) Only the organiser/sponsor of the event may provide alcoholic drinks: participants are required not to bring their own alcohol onto the premises
- 6) Alcoholic drinks must not be sold at the event for consumption off the premises
- 7) Alternative soft drinks must be available
- 8) The organiser/sponsor will take responsibility for ensuring that no person under 18 years consumes alcohol on any part of the premises
- 9) Alcoholic drinks will only be consumed within the room booked for the event
- 10) All drinks containers brought onto the premises by or at the instance of the Hirer will be removed from the premises hired and any other church premises at the end of the event
