

## **Introduction to Dulverton Parish Rooms**

The Parish Rooms, located at the end of Rosemary Lane, off Dulverton's High Street is a versatile space suitable for a variety of uses, from individuals or groups, to events, private celebrations, art displays and craft shows.

The building was a gift of the Wills Family and bequeathed to the citizens of Dulverton, Somerset in 1906. Since then, it has been managed by a voluntary group of Trustees drawn from the local community, keen to see it still provide a service to the residents and beyond.

In a recent renovation, the original Canadian pine parquet floor was re-discovered downstairs and restored.

Today it is home to the Dulverton Players, our popular local amateur dramatics group, able to prepare for the next production which take place regularly at the Town Hall, round the corner on Fore Street.

The Ground Floor however is available to anyone that needs a well-lit, airy room for their group or function. This has a modern heating system comprising of ceiling mounted heating units which double as air conditioning units to cool things down in the Summer. Adjoining the main room or hall, is a small kitchen and separate washroom with WC.

There's a modern fire alarm system, fire doors and extinguishers.

The aim of the board of Trustees is to see this useful local facility become more widely used and, by benefiting the local community, seek external funding to support the future costs of maintaining and improving this important and historic community asset.
